men and a delegation from the United Order of Foresters, headed by the City faind, mirched from No. 2 fire hall yes-terday afternoon to the dweifing. Owing to the limited room in the house

the firemen were unable to attend the their conclusion. The house was completely filled with friends of the dead fireman and as many more were compelled to remain outside, all anxlious, however, do pay a last tribute of respect to

a man that died at his post of duty.

The services were conducted by Rev. G. R. Geer, postor of Grace Medical, of church, and they were yery impossive The preacher paid a fine tribute to the dead direman, saying that the herosmod firemen in saving property and lives is as great as that shown on the bat lefield.

Music was furnished by a mixed quarter consisting of Mrs. Hopkies, Mrs. Haun, Miss Hopkins and Mrs. Shonberg. At the conclusion of the services that

casket was opened and all that wished were permitted to view the face of the departed. After the room was cleared the detactment of police and firemen filed slowly through the room and took a let-look at the face of their dead comrude and friend. The casket was then tenderly placed on hose wagon No. 2, by six comrades of the dead fireman, who acted as pall bearers.

The hose wagon was draped in deep black and the casket was placed amid
